## **MAJOR**

Students who pursue a BA in Ethnic Studies will engage in lower division foundational Ethnic Studies coursework (9 units), upper division theory and methodology coursework (9 units) and upper division electives of their choice (21 units) for a total BA in Ethnic Studies major of 39 units.

## **DOUBLE MAJOR**

Students also may blend other area studies with Ethnic Studies through the addition of Ethnic Studies as a double major. Those who choose to double major will engage with lower division foundational Ethnic Studies coursework (9 units), upper division theory and methodology coursework (9 units), and upper division electives of their choice (9 units) for a total double major addition of 27 Ethnic Studies units.
